Q What sort of activities were there?

A There were three long walks (or route marches) – up Thorpe Cloud, over Bunster Hill and around the mountains near Castleton. We cycled mountain bikes on the Tissington Trail and visited an underground cavern. There was a trip to Chatsworth House and Gardens and a *whole day* at Alton Towers.

Q Did you have to do all the walks?

A Not much at first – too much to talk about - but it got easier as the week went on. After that you're so tired you fall asleep as soon as your head hits the pillow. You have to be in your dormitory at 9:30pm and lights out by 10:00pm.

Q Are there any showers?

A Yes, and the staff insist you take one at least once a day – they find out by checking if your towel is wet. There are also regular room inspections and if your room is messy you are not allowed outside until it is cleared.
