### **Primary PE and Sport Premium – Five Key Indicators**

3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• WLJS was awarded 'SPSSA KS2 School of the Year 2023'</li> <li>• Three of our Year 6 children were awarded 'SPSSA Sports Performer of the Year 2023'</li> <li>• A variety of extra-curricular sports clubs have been organised for children of all ages, genders and abilities.</li> <li>• Sporting and physical activity participation and achievements have been celebrated in assemblies.</li> <li>• WLJS were winners of competitive events such as Borough Sports, Sportshall Athletics, the Swimming Gala and many more.</li> <li>• All children were trialled against each other for competitive events so that all children had an equal opportunity to represent the school.</li> <li>• The school reached the Essex finals in several different sports.</li> <li>• A whole school sports morning was organised in which all children participated and parents were able to spectate again.</li> <li>• Children in all year groups have participated in weekly swimming lessons and 100% of Year 6 leavers can swim competently over a distance of at least 25m.</li> <li>• The school has achieved a gold award for the School Games Mark for the sixth year running, which means West Leigh Junior School now has a platinum award.</li> <li>• Moki bands continued to have a positive impact on children's physical activity levels.
