Tuck	Updates     from     previous     meeting	<ul> <li>Mrs Rodger attended today's meeting to follow up on some of the points raised last term:</li> <li>Naked Smoothies would work out too expensive for the tuck shop. Instead, Mrs Rodger has suggested that she can make fresh fruit smoothies for either Tuesdays or Wednesdays. Councillors sampled a banana and strawberry smoothie during today's meeting which everybody agreed was delicious!</li> <li>Fruit pick 'n' mix will also be more varied from now on. Mrs Rodger will start to include pineapple, mango and melon although she will not be able to use cherries due to the stones. Carrot and cucumber sticks will also be made available some weeks, as requested.</li> <li>As most dried fruit is often not good for our teeth, Mrs Rodger allowed the councillors to sample banana chips. The councillors thought these were incredibly tasty so these will also be on offer in the tuck shop soon.</li> <li>Josh from 6D, kindly dehydrated some apple and kiwi for the School Council to try (as this is another, healthy alternative). The results went down very well so Mrs Rodger will investigate the cost of sourcing our own dehydrator.</li> </ul>
Bike Racks	Following a recent suggestion that more bike racks are needed, Mrs Carr and members of the School Council have been monitoring how full the bike racks become throughout the week. It has been decided that there are enough racks at the moment but if this becomes an issue in the future, the School Council will discuss obtaining more.	
Snack Baskets	Following a suggestion that each class should have a basket for snack pots (due to these often becoming lost at break time), councillors discussed the views gathered from each class. It seems as though most classes do not want to have baskets as many are concerned they will become a trip hazard on the playground. If some classes in Years 3 and 4 would like to organise for their class to have a snack basket, please let Mrs Carr know so that a safe storage area/routine can be organised.	
Pupil Led Clubs	Children in Years 5 and 6 have been invited to run their own club during the summer term. Councillors in upper school have been given all the details. Clubs will run for 6 weeks, starting after the Easter break.
