Honour Based Abuse (including FGM) - Y4 PSHE lessons on personal space and naming of sexual body parts. - Y6 PSHE unit on healthy relationships – covers consent, laws on marriage around the world.	Mental Health - PSHE units in Year 4 and 6 teach the children skills needed to recognise and manage their emotions. - Mental Health week is covered within assemblies. - Regular opportunities for reflection and self-expression in art and music. - Y6 secondary transition work. - Resilience workshop for targeted pupils.	Physical Health - Importance of physical health and the tools to keep healthy are covered regularly within our PE curriculum. - Weekly swimming lessons for all children. - Y4 PSHE unit – ‘How Can I Look After my Body?’ - Y3 science includes sun safety awareness. - Cooking and nutrition in Y4 and 5 DT focuses on making healthy choices. - Healthy cookery club.	Personal Safety - Water safety/lifesaving skills taught within swimming lessons. - First aid taught as part of Y5 PSHE curriculum. - Visits from fire service on water safety, fireworks/Halloween. - Walk-It training in Y5 for road safety. - Risk assessments for trips are shared with children. - Y6 PSHE unit – ‘How Can I Keep Myself Safe’ covers creating safety plans.
